In order for students to earn a **Criminal Justice Diploma (D55180)**, the following courses must be taken: CIS 110, CJC 111, CJC 112, CJC 113, CJC 131, CJC 212, CJC 221, CJC 231, ENG 111, ENG 112, and Math Option (Choose One): MAT 143 or MAT 152. And, select any three (3) of the following courses: CJC 132, CJC 141, CJC 160, CJC 215, and CJC 233.

In order for students to earn a **Law Enforcement Certificate (C55180L)**, the following courses must be taken: CJC 111, CJC 112, CJC 221, CJC 222, and CJC 231.

In order for students to earn a **Corrections Certificate (C55180C)**, the following courses must be taken: CJC 111, CJC 112, CJC 113, CJC 141, CJC 212, and CJC 233.

The courses listed on this program guide are the courses currently offered online through Richmond Community College. Please speak to your advisor if you have taken courses at another college or university.
