Elementary Education Articulation Agreement Between St. Andrews Preshyterian College and Richmond Community College

Spring 2006

- A. Students will be admitted as candidates for the articulation program in elementary education upon completion of the A.A. or A.S.
- B. Students, regardless of concentration, must earn and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.50 before being admitted to the teacher education program.
- C. The requirements for continuing in the program are: (1) a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50 on all credits attempted; (2) behavior which adheres to the code of ethics of the profession; and (3) satisfactory participation in the required professional field experiences, which is prerequisite to the student teaching experience. An evaluation of each field experience assignment will become a part of the student's professional record.
- D. This agreement will run continually without the need for annual renewal. Copies of this agreement will be distributed to the deans and department heads by April 1, of each year. Any updates to this agreement should be submitted by March 1. If curriculum changes occur in any of the courses identified in this agreement, parties from both institutions will review the changes and update the course equivalency outline.
- E. Either party upon sixty days written notice can terminate this agreement. If the agreement is terminated, students who have matriculated at St. Andrews can continue until completion of the baccalaureate degree if they are continuously enrolled at St. Andrews. Also, students who are enrolled at the time may continue under the terms of the agreement as long as they are continuously enrolled. If the student ceases enrollment for two regular academic semesters, he/she must re-enroll under the most recently adopted agreement.
