Back by popular demand, celebrating what would have been Sinatra's 100th birthday



What better way to commemorate what would have been Frank Sinatra's 100th birthday (December 12, 2015) than with a modern-day Sinatra...Steve Lippia. Another of the most requested past artist, Lippia performed as part of the DeWitt Series in October 2009.

Reminiscent of the young Sinatra, Bobby Darin and Harry Connick, Jr., Steve Lippia moves from crisp, popping swing tunes to lush, poignant ballads with confidence. His natural sound and style are a remarkable combination of his own honest musical interpretation and the influence of the best singers of an incredible era of American music.

With great stage presence, charm and ease, Steve pulls his audience back in time to a comfort zone not often available from the concert stage today. He delivers his music in a deeply personal way and includes standards permanently engraved in the American History of Music: "I've Got You Under My Skin," "The Lady is a Tramp," "Mack the Knife," "Just the Way You Are," "That's Life". It all comes back to us again through the work of Steve Lippia.

With a hot, driving band behind him, Lippia impeccably delivers the best repertoire of the Big Band era and American Classic Pop, leaving his audience begging for more...Steve Lippia: A "once-in-a-century artist".
