

How do I Qualify for College Transfer Pathway Program

- ◆ To be eligible for enrollment, a high school student must meet the following criteria:
 - * Be a high school junior or senior;
 - * Have a weighted GPA of 3.0 on high school courses; and
 - * Demonstrate college readiness on a single assessment or placement test. A student must demonstrate college readiness in English, Reading and Mathematics.
- ◆ To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a student must
 - * Continue to make progress toward high school graduation, and
 - * Maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework after completing two courses.
- ◆ A student must enroll in one College Transfer Pathway program of study and may not substitute courses in one program for courses in another.

College Readiness Benchmarks on Diagnostic Assessment Tests

Test	PLAN	ACT	SAT	PSAT	ACCUPLACER
English	15	18	500	45	86 Sentence Skills
Reading	17	22	500	47	80 Reading
Mathematics	19	22	500	47	7 or above on DMA 010-060

To be eligible for enrollment in a College Transfer Pathway, students must demonstrate college readiness in English, reading, and mathematics on an approved test or tests. Eligibility may be demonstrated by achieving the required scores on a single test or by combining test scores from any of the approved assessments. For example, a student may combine a 19 on PLAN math with an 86 in sentence skills and an 80 in reading on the Accuplacer to demonstrate college readiness.
