## How do I Qualify for College Transfer Pathway Program

• To be eligible for enrollment, a high school student must meet the following criteria:

- \* Be a high school junior or senior;
- \* Have a weighted GPA of 3.0 on high school courses; and
- \* Demonstrate college readiness on a single assessment or placement test. A student must demonstrate college readiness in English, Reading and Mathematics.
- To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a student must
  - \* Continue to make progress toward high school graduation, and
  - \* Maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework after completing two courses.
- A student must enroll in one College Transfer Pathway program of study and may not substitute courses in one program for courses in another.

To be eligible for enrollment in a College Transfer Pathway, students must demonstrate college readiness in English, reading, and mathematics on an approved test or tests. Eligibility may be demonstrated by achieving the required scores on a single test or by combining test scores from any of the approved assessments. For example, a student may combine a 19 on PLAN math with an 86 in sentence skills and an 80 in reading on the Accuplacer to demonstrate college readiness.
