**Memorandum of Understanding
Between**

**North Carolina Wesleyan College
and
Richmond Community College**

North Carolina Wesleyan College, Incorporated and **Richmond** Community College hereby enter into the following agreement governing the matriculation at North Carolina Wesleyan College of graduates from **Richmond Community College**.

The objectives of this agreement are:

1. To promote the easy transition of qualified transfer students from **Richmond** Community College to bachelor degree programs at North Carolina Wesleyan College.
2. To provide specific information for transfer students intending to pursue bachelor's degrees.
3. To provide an alternate route to quality education for students who are seeking to earn a bachelor's degree.

The parties to this agreement, North Carolina Wesleyan College and **Richmond** Community College, hereby agree to the following terms and conditions set forth herein.

North Carolina Wesleyan College agrees to grant any student who is the recipient of a Criminal Justice associate degree from **Richmond** Community College, sixty hours towards the baccalaureate degree and junior standing. Wesleyan will also provide **Richmond** Community College with a complete list of courses we accept from NC Community Colleges and how they transfer to North Carolina Wesleyan College. **The coursework for the Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice will be offered 100% online.**

The parties further agree that the holder of a Criminal Justice associate degree from **Richmond** Community College who elects to continue his or her studies toward a baccalaureate degree at North Carolina Wesleyan College will be required to satisfy all program and degree requirements, as described in the North Carolina Wesleyan College catalog, effective at the time of his or her initial enrollment at Wesleyan. The student will be advised of those requirements at or before the time of matriculation. Since remaining degree requirements will be determined by specific courses transferred and remaining general education, major, and elective requirements at Wesleyan, students may be required to complete more than the minimum semester hours required for graduation.

Associate degrees included in the articulation agreement are listed below. This agreement is for graduates of RCC to complete their degree online with NCWC.


Course work in associate degrees not listed above are not included in the articulation agreement but will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Please review the Wesleyan comprehensive transfer guide for community colleges.

North Carolina Wesleyan College will designate a member of the admissions staff to be a main point of contact for **Richmond** Community College to facilitate the transfer of students who have completed their degree program at **Richmond** Community College. **Richmond** Community College will do the same. North Carolina Wesleyan College requests that **Richmond** Community College forward to North Carolina Wesleyan College a list or computer file of the names and home or email addresses of any student anticipating the completion of an associate degree in the areas listed above. Richmond CC graduates will receive a 12% discount off the current tuition rate. Students will always pay a comparable rate to the direct cost of attending a state university benchmarked against NC State and UNC.

Graduates of RCC **MUST** complete the following courses at RCC or transfer them in from another school in order to complete their entire Criminal Justice degree online with NC Wesleyan College. NCWC does not offer the following courses online. This assumes students take ART 111 as part of their CJ degree program at RCC.

- Literature
- Statistics
- BIO Lab
