COURSE: CJC 113 JUVENILE JUSTICE

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers the juvenile justice system and related juvenile issues. Topics include an overview of the juvenile justice system, treatment and prevention programs, special areas and laws unique to juveniles, and other related topics. Upon completion, students should be able to identify/discuss juvenile court structure/procedures, function and jurisdiction of juvenile agencies, processing/detention of juveniles, and case disposition.

- 5. Describe the role of law enforcement in working with youth and youthful offenders.
- 6. Locate the sections of the North Carolina Juvenile Code that define key juvenile justice terminology including, but not limited to, "delinquent" juveniles and "abused and neglected" juveniles.
- 7. Analyze juvenile case scenarios involving criminal charges, status offenses, abuse and neglect and/or child abuse.
- 8. Identify the attitude toward, and the handling of, juvenile delinquency in a selected international culture.
