

How do I Qualify for a College Transfer Pathway Program

- ❖ To be eligible for enrollment, a high school student must meet the following criteria:
 - Be a high school junior or senior;
 - Have a weighted GPA of 3.0 on high school courses; and
 - Demonstrate college readiness on a single assessment or placement test. A student must demonstrate college readiness in English, Reading and Mathematics.

- ❖ To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a student must
 - Continue to make progress toward high school graduation, and
 - Maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework after completing two courses.

College Readiness Benchmarks on Diagnostic Assessment Tests

To be eligible for enrollment in a College Transfer Pathway, students must demonstrate college readiness in English, reading and mathematics on an approved test or tests. Eligibility may be demonstrated by achieving the required scores on a single test or by combining test scores from any of the approved assessments. For example, a student may combine a 22 on ACT math with an 86 in sentence skills and an 80 in reading on the Accuplacer to demonstrate college readiness.
