In order for students to earn an Accounting Specialist Certificate (C25800A), the following courses must be taken: ACC 120, ACC 121, CIS 110, Math Option (MAT 143 or MAT 152), and select any one (1) of the following courses: ECO 251 or ECO 252.

In order for students to earn an Accounting/Bookkeeper Certificate (C25800B), the following courses must be taken: ACC 120, ACC 122, ACC 150, ACC 180, BUS 121, and CIS 110.

In order for students to earn a Payroll Accountant Specialist Certificate (C25800C), the following courses must be taken: ACC 120, ACC 140, ACC 150, BUS 217, CIS 110, and CTS 130.

In order for students to earn a Tax Preparer Certificate (C25800D), the following courses must be taken: ACC 120, ACC 129, ACC 130, BUS 125 and, CIS 110.

Students enrolled in WBL 111 and WBL 115, who reside outside of Richmond county and Scotland county North Carolina will need to work under an active, licensed CPA or at an instructor approved location.

The courses listed on this program guide are the courses currently offered online through Richmond Community College. Please speak to your advisor if you have taken courses at another college or university.

The following courses are part of the North Carolina Articulation Agreement: ACC 120, ACC 121, ART 111, BUS 110, BUS 115, BUS 137, CIS 110, COM 231, ENG 111, ENG 112, ENG 231, ENG 232, MAT 143, MUS 110, PHI 240, and SPA 111.
