

DUAL DEGREE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

RICHMOND COMMUNITY COLLEGE

AND

FAYETTEVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY

- I. This dual degree articulation agreement assures students at Richmond Community College (RCC) that if they complete all courses outlined in the attached dual degree plan with a grade of C or better, they will receive an Associate's Degree from RCC and a Bachelor's Degree from Fayetteville State University (FSU) in the specified discipline.
- II. To qualify for this program, an individual must complete an Associate's Degree at RCC, submit all application materials to FSU, and meet all requirements for transfer admissions.
- III. Upon receipt of the student's transcript, FSU will award transfer credit for all courses included in the dual degree plan in which the student earned a final grade of C or higher.
- IV. Student may enroll simultaneously at both institutions prior to completing the Associate's Degree with permission from RCC. FSU will admit approved students as Special Visiting (non-degree seeking) student at FSU.
- V. Students will receive a degree plan that will specify the courses required at each institution, with equivalent courses noted to earn an A.A.S. in Accounting at RCC and a B.S. in Accounting at FSU.
- VI. Students will be responsible for fulfilling all obligations of both institutions including tuition and all required fees.
- VII. Qualified faculty members will teach all courses accepted for transfer to FSU. RCC will ensure that faculty teaching courses for transfer meet the standards set forth in the Principles of Accreditation, Comprehensive Standard 3.7.1 and Faculty Guidelines by the Southern Association for Colleges and Schools, Standard 6.2a.
- VIII. The dual degree articulation agreement in Accounting, between FSU and RCC will be effective January 1, 2019. FSU and RCC will review this agreement for renewal every five (5) years or sooner as deemed necessary by the curriculum changes at one or both institutions.


IX. This is the entire agreement between the parties. It replaces and supersedes any and all oral agreements between the parties, as well as any prior written agreement. This agreement shall not be varied or amended except by written consent of both parties.


X. **TERMS**


- a. This Agreement is effective as of the date of the fully executed document and shall remain in effect for five (5) years from the date the agreement is signed. Both parties must approve amendments to the Agreement in writing.
- b. Either party may terminate the Agreement without cause upon 90 days written notice to the other party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may terminate the Agreement immediately in the event that participation under the Agreement may give rise to a violation of any requirement under federal or state law or regulation or the requirements of any accrediting agency having jurisdiction.
- c. Admission criteria, academic requirements, and other admission requirements will be subject to the applicable catalog at the time of the student's admission to FSU. If this articulation agreement is terminated for any reason, graduates of RCC enrolled in the program will be permitted to complete their program.
- d. The parties grant to each other a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use each other's trademarks and service marks in furtherance of the articulation agreement detailed herein or in a manner solely for the purpose of identifying and communicating the existence of the relationship to RCC students and alumni. Use of trademarks, service marks and logos will comply with policies of the originating institution. The parties shall discontinue the use of the licensed marks and return any and all files and materials containing the licensed marks supplied by the owner at the termination or expiration of the Agreement. Neither party grants to the other any interest in the other party's trademarks. Should either originating institution request, in writing, that a particular use of the originating institution's trademarks and/or service marks be discontinued, the non-originating institution shall cease and discontinue such use of the trademarks and/or service marks.
- e. The parties hereto will have the relationship of independent contractors for all purposes. Each will have complete control over its own performance and the details for accomplishing its own obligations under this Agreement. In no event will the agents, representatives or employees of one party be deemed to be agents, representatives or employees of the other.
- f. The Agreement may be executed by a duly authorized representative of each party, either by electronic or facsimile transmission, each of which will be considered an original.


Each party has caused this Agreement to be executed by its duly authorized representative as of January 1, 2019.



1. If 30 hours or more are transferred to FSU the Freshman Seminar is waived.
2. If 60 hours or more are transferred to FSU the Reasoning Skills-Critical Thinking and the Ethic & Civic Engagement requirements are waived.
3. Students who complete an Associates of Applied Science degree in Accounting at RCC will have remaining University College Core Curriculum courses and Business Core Curriculum courses to take at FSU.
4. Courses not used to meet University or Business Core may be used as free electives.
5. Total hours required for a BS in Accounting at FSU is 121 hours.
