

Memorandum of Understanding

Between

Richmond Community College

And

Lees-McRae College

Guaranteed Admission Program

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made on the 29th day of September 2020, by and between Lees-McRae College ("LMC") and Richmond Community College ("Richmond CC") to establish a Guaranteed Admission Program (GAP) for all Richmond CC students who meet certain academic requirements to transfer and complete a bachelor's degree at LMC.

This agreement furthers the efforts of both institutions to meet the educational needs of the citizens of North Carolina and to work cooperatively to improve access to private higher education. This agreement is intended for successful Richmond CC students who plan to transfer to LMC after completing an Associate's degree. Any Richmond CC student who earns an Associate of Arts (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.), Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.), and Associate in Fine Arts (A.F.A.) will be automatically admitted to LMC, with cumulative grade point averages as listed below.

Each student seeking to transfer from Richmond CC to LMC will be admitted and earn the necessary academic credits needed through a state-wide articulation agreement, an institutional program-to-program articulation agreement, or a transfer credit evaluation. Furthermore, Richmond CC students admitted to LMC will receive academic merit scholarships that range in amounts up to and including 60% off LMC annual tuition. These merit-based awards are greater than amounts other transfers to LMC will receive and are guaranteed for the duration of the student's stay at LMC, provided the student remains in good academic standing.

THEREFORE, the parties to this MOU mutually agree as follows:

- 1. All Richmond CC students seeking transfer to the LMC main campus academic programs, with an A.A., A.S., A.A.S., or A.F.A. degree and an overall grade point average of **2.2** or higher, are guaranteed admission into the following programs:
 - Business Administration (B.S.)
 - Criminal Justice (B.A., B.S.)
 - English (B.A.)
 - History (B.A., B.S.)
 - Nutrition Science (B.S.)
 - Psychology (B.A., B.S.)
 - Sport Management (B.A., B.S.)

- Communication Arts & Design (B.S., B.A.)
- Emergency Medical Services & Management (B.S.)
- Exercise Science (B.S.)
- Musical Theatre (B.F.A.)
- Outdoor Recreation Management (B.S.)
- Religious Studies (B.A., B.S.)
- Theatre Arts (B.A., B.S.)

- Theatre Arts Administration (B.S.)
- 2. All Richmond CC students seeking transfer to the LMC main campus academic programs, with an A.A., A.S., A.A.S., or A.F.A. degree and an overall grade point average of **2.5 or higher**, are guaranteed admission into the following programs:
 - Biology (B.S.)

- Wildlife Biology (B.S.)
- Pre-Veterinary Medicine (B.S.)
- Pre-Physical Therapy (B.S.)
- 3. Additionally, students seeking to enter our Elementary Education, Special Education or Nursing Program must meet the following for each intended major.

Elementary & Special Education

Richmond CC transfer students must meet the same requirements for admission to and exit from the program as traditional candidates. This includes admission to the online degree completion program in Elementary Education. In order to ensure that these requirements are met, transfer and licensure-only candidates must follow the procedures outlined below:

- Must have cumulative **2.7** GPA or higher, must meet the "C" standard set for the Teacher Education Program
- Upon acceptance into Lees-McRae College, students will submit an application for the education program along with completing the Praxis (5751) with a composite of 468 or higher, by November 1st of their Junior Year.

To receive recommendation for licensure from Lees-McRae College, candidates must take the last 32 hours of professional education course work, including student teaching, through the Lees-McRae Teacher Education Program.

Nursing Program:

- Must meet the Application requirements for the Nursing Program. This includes our RN to BSN and LPN to BSN online degree completion program.
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or greater
- "B-" or higher earned in courses designated as BIO, MAT, CHM or HWS
- 4. All Richmond CC students seeking transfer to one of LMC's online degree completion programs, with an A.A., A.S., A.A.S., or A.F.A. degree and an overall grade point average of **2.2 or higher**, are guaranteed admission into the following programs:
 - Business Administration (B.S.)
- Human Services (B.A.A.S.)

Criminal Justice (B.A.A.S.)

5. Academic Merit Scholarships

Richmond CC students who are admitted to one of LMC's main campus programs as part of this GAP will automatically receive the following academic scholarships. These scholarships are termed New Horizon Transfer Scholarships and are awarded only to full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits a semester).

•	3.9 GPA and above	\$14,000 per academic year (\$7,000 per semester)
•	3.6-3.8 GPA	\$13,000 per academic year (\$6,500 per semester)
•	3.3-3.5 GPA	\$12,000 per academic year (\$6,000 per semester)
•	3.0-3.2 GPA	\$11,000 per academic year (\$5,500 per semester)
•	2.2-2.9 GPA	\$10,000 per academic year (\$5,000 per semester)
•	Phi Theta Kappa Members*	\$2,000 per academic year (\$1,000 per semester)

*Members of Phi Theta Kappa are awarded the \$2,000 in addition to any other academic scholarship offered. This must be listed on Richmond CC official transcript or on official letterhead from an appropriate Richmond CC employee.

Note: New Horizon Transfer Scholarships are awarded to transfer students based off their academic performance at Richmond CC prior to enrolling at LMC. Students must remain in good academic standing with a cumulative GPA of a 2.0 or better while enrolled at LMC in order to maintain this scholarship.

Richmond CC students who enroll in one of LMC's online degree completion programs will receive a tuition discount of \$30 per credit hour. This results in a tuition price of \$320 per credit hour, with the normal price being \$350 per credit hour.

Additional Requirements

- All Richmond CC students must fill out the LMC application for admission, or they can submit the Common Application. The application fee will be waived for all Richmond CC students who submit an application to LMC with the LMC institutional application.
- Richmond CC must submit an official transcript to LMC. Students must meet all LMC admissions standards listed in this MOU at the time of matriculation to LMC, including but not limited to academic success and academic standing. This includes an evaluation of any criminal or disciplinary issues.
- Credit is automatically given for courses completed with a grade of C or better.
- Courses with "C-" or "D" grade may also be granted by the appropriate dean, chair or faculty member provided the course does not alter requirements of the student's major of study and LMC graduation requirements.
- Details contained in specific academic program-to-program articulation agreements will override items contained in this Guaranteed Admission Program. This does not change the guaranteed admission and scholarship amounts listed in this MOU.

- Richmond CC students should apply for admission to LMC and directly to the intended major/academic program of study during the second semester of sophomore year at Richmond CC.
- Qualified graduates entering LMC under the terms of this Guaranteed Admission Program who decide
 to enroll at LMC must pay a non-refundable \$250.00 enrollment commitment fee. This fee signals the
 student's intent to enroll at LMC and serves as the mandatory fee for new student orientation,
 academic advising, course registration, welcome week activities, and all services provided to incoming
 transfer students through the LMC Office of New Student Engagement.
- Richmond CC students are encouraged to apply for additional financial aid by filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The LMC Title IV School Code is 002939.
- Richmond CC students whose GPA falls below the minimum required for guaranteed admission may still be accepted on a case-by-case basis upon thorough review of their application and any supporting documentation.

Agreement

LMC and Richmond CC will enter this agreement beginning with Spring Semester of 2021, and this entire document will be reviewed on a bi-annual basis and revised as needed. It is understood by both parties that this agreement is subject to review and revision as deemed necessary by both parties to ensure compliance with all local, state, and national accrediting bodies' policies and expectations.

Both LMC and Richmond CC give mutual assurance that in performing their duties under this agreement, they will not discriminate on the basis of age, ancestry, citizenship status, color, disability, gender, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation, veteran status, or other protected group. Reasonable accommodations for participation by disabled persons will be made in compliance with Section 504 of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

As soon as the proper college officials of the two aforementioned institutions have signed this agreement, each is free to publicize and utilize this arrangement as deemed appropriate.
