COURSE: ENG 242 BRITISH LITERATURE II

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers selected works in British literature from the Romantic Period to the present. Emphasis is placed on historical background, cultural context, and literary analysis of selected prose, poetry, and drama. Upon completion, students should be able to interpret, analyze, and respond to literary works in their historical and cultural contexts.

- 6. Complete a critical analysis of a literary work from one of the major periods of study.
