

Academic Suspension

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A student may re-enroll at the College after one semester of academic suspension by contacting a counselor to update his/her plan for improving academic performance. The student will be required to retake courses where he/she has a D, F, or F to increase his/her GPA and will be limited to a reduced load of no more than nine (9) credit hours.
